### **Opening Sentences**

O Lord open our lips
And our mouth shall proclaim your praise.

The night has passed and the day lies open before us.

Pause for reflection and offer the day to God

As we rejoice in the gift of this new day, so may the light of your presence, O God, set our hearts on fire with love for you; now and for ever. Amen



#### **Bible Gospel Reading**

We shall follow the daily lectionary readings which are found on Parish Notes/Notices and on our websites.

#### **Psalm 23** The LORD is my shepherd, I shall not want.

He makes me lie down in green pastures; he leads me beside still waters; he restores my soul.
He leads me in right paths for his name's sake.

Even though I walk through the darkest valley, I fear no evil; for you are with me; your rod and your staff—they comfort me.

You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies; you anoint my head with oil; my cup overflows.

Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life, and I shall dwell in the house of the LORD my whole life long.

Other Psalms that you might like to include here are Psalm 16, Psalm 46 and Psalm 139...
