#### **Carol Singing in Trafalgar Square**

On 23<sup>rd</sup> December, for the first time since 2019, Ash Church Choir, together with friends from Local Vocals, Front Room and others, were finally able to return to sing carols under the Christmas tree in Trafalgar Square. The weather was extremely kind to us, the previous persistent rain stopping just as we were about to sing, and we spent a magical hour performing our repertoire of well-known traditional carols. A large and appreciative audience gathered on the steps, and joined enthusiastically in the 'audience participation' numbers. Before returning home, we were treated by our coach driver to a tour of the spectacular Christmas lights in the West End. On the day we raised over £300 for the Ellenor Hospice, and that, together with money previously raised at Woodlands Garden Centre, meant that we were able to send them a total donation of £421.37.

The church is open every day for you to spend time in prayer, reflection or just savouring the quiet and peace that is found there.



#### **CHURCH CLEANING TEAMS**

This is a big THANK YOU to all the hard working congregation members who volunteered to join (or rejoin) the church and brass cleaning teams in spring last year.
