2026 SPONSORED RIDE AND STRIDE

The date for this year's event is **Saturday 12 September**. You can cycle or walk to as many or as few churches as you want between 10:00am and 6:00pm – choose your own route to any of the hundreds of participating churches.

Half the money raised by each participant helps to support churches across the county and the other half goes to a church chosen by the walker or cyclist (we hope you will choose our church!). Please help to raise funds to support Ash or Ridley Churches and the many others in the County that receive grants towards the cost of essential maintenance work. If you pay income tax, do remember to tick the box on the sponsorship form so that Gift Aid increases the money raised.

This year Kent Ride and Stride are hoping to beat last year's record total of £152,674. The Ride and Stride was by far the biggest fundraiser towards the £176,500 given to 39 churches in 2025.

Remember to ask your sponsors to tick the gift aid box if they are taxpayers because this adds a substantial amount to the total money raised.

There will also be an opportunity for the less active to help by spending an hour or more at Ash Church between 10 o'clock and 6 o'clock to greet visiting cyclists and walkers. It's not an onerous task – all that is needed is to sign their forms and keep a record of their call and to offer them some refreshment and encouragement (especially if their next call is up the hill to West Kingsdown or Stansted!). Please put your name on the form on the notice board in Ash Church if you can help. We now have to comply with the church's lone working policy which means that there should be at least two people present in the building at any time to ensure that no-one is alone with any potentially vulnerable visitors. Therefore, we will need twice as many volunteers.

You can do more! The Friends of Kent Churches also invite people to become members. For just £10 a year (£15 for a couple) members enjoy guided visits to churches and lectures on subjects related to church history, architecture, art and related topics. Born in 2001, Eva Victoria Schockmel is a classical guitarist from Luxembourg. Embarking on her musical journey at the Conservatoire de la Ville d'Esch-sur-Alzette, she developed her passion for the guitar in the class of Christian Peckels from the age of seven, culminating in a 'Diplôme Supérieur' with 'Grande Distinction'.

In 2025, Eva Victoria earned her Bachelor's degree at the Conservatorium van Amsterdam in the class of Gabriel Bianco, graduating with the highest distinction. Alongside solo recitals, she is an avid chamber musician (e.g. Duo Encordé and Pulsar Quartet), orchestra soloist (e.g. Luxembourg Philharmonic Orchestra and Cambridge Graduate Orchestra) and performs in prestigious concert halls (Wigmore Hall, Het Concertgebouw, Kings Place and Philharmonie Luxembourg).

Recent competition awards in 2025 comprise the 2nd Prize at the Uppsala International Young Talents Competition, 3rd Prize at the 14th Martinez Guitar Duo Competition in Iserlohn and 3rd Prize as well as Audience Prize at the Mantovani International Guitar Festival.

Passionate about guitar, percussion and arranging, Eva Victoria pursues her postgraduate studies as a Neville Wathen Scholar at the Royal College of Music in London, under the guidance of Gary Ryan and Christopher Stell. She is an Awardee of the International Guitar Foundation as part of their Young Artist Platform 2025-2026.

The Big Knit 2026

Baby loss touches so many families and the awful statistic still of 1 in every 4 babies being lost is tragic. Baby loss and the impact it has on life for so many families is often still not well supported, so I am delighted that Kent and Medway registered charity continues their work, started back in 2014, offering services to so many who need them.

As part of raising awareness, National Baby Loss Awareness week runs from 9th - 15th October every year, and each year Making Miracles holds their annual Big Knit at Rochester Cathedral to continue that raising awareness locally for families within our Diocese.

People everywhere in Kent are invited to attend this event from 10:00am to 1:00pm on Saturday 10 October at the Cathedral, bringing with them any newly knitted or crocheted baby items to donate to the charity. In addition, for the first time for those in the West of

the Diocese, St Luke's Church in Sevenoaks has offered to host the same event on the day before, Friday 9th October, again from 10:00am to 1:00pm, where Trustees from Making Miracles will also be there to tell people about their work.

On the day itself people are invited to bring with them wool and their needles (or hook), and either continue with some knitting they are already doing for Making Miracles or to knit a small pair of booties during that morning to donate at the end. Then, as always, people may also knit the traditional squares 6 inches x 6 inches which will be sewn up into blankets.

Please could you ensure that your parishioners and any local craft groups in your parish are made aware of the event and also that they feel free to circulate the poster attached more widely. The contacts for any questions or queries are detailed on the individual event details and if people could also let those people know if your church is attending that will help with refreshments etc.

I do hope that people will pop the dates in their diaries now so that these events are well supported.
